  - a. Bingo workers arrive at 2:45
  - b. There were 234 people on 2/7/15, made \$11,000 gross profit, about \$600 at the snack bar
  - c. Increase in attendance because of increased pot size, GHS parents, Susan Kinder, Kelly Bowers attended
  - d. Looking for more volunteers, overwhelmed by attendance
  - e. Future outlook: good for the next 4 months, tapers during the summer. Will look at the average per quarter.
  - f. Need people to play and volunteer
- II. Brian Poynter
  - a. Lost a member of the Class of 2014 in an accident on Grant Line Rd. /580, Andrew Kling. He played volleyball and was artistic. A good kid. Candle light vigil was held on Saturday. This has been hard for the seniors. Services have not been set.
  - b. GHS Expo on March 25, expect about 2500 people, Food truck Mafia
  - c. T2 ends 2<sup>nd</sup> week of March
  - d. Mrs. Rambo would like to hold a yearly gala- fundraiser for GHS
  - e. There may be a change in the rule about alcohol on campus for adult events.
  - f. Boys and Girls basketball may qualify for NCS
  - g. Soccer closes Friday with game against LHS
    - i. Boys Varsity at 4:30 at LHS, Girls Varsity kick off at 6:30 at GHS
- III. PCIC – Roxanne Kusske
  - a. School Board member, Anne White, presented.
    - i. School board run according to the Brown Act
- IV. Webcasting – Brad Morisoli

- a. Received a check from Les Schwab and Carl's Jr. for sponsorship
- b. Spring sports start soon – still need help
- V. Grad Night – Stephanie Eassa
  - a. There are 452 students in the class of 2015 and 230 have signed up.
  - b. Joint fundraiser with LHS at Wentz on March 6. 95 people signed up, max is 150.
  - c. Duck Races coming up
- VI. Snack Bar – Sharon White
  - a. Boys and Girls basketball doing their own snack bar
- VII. Old Business
  - a. Brad still needs coordinators for Webcasting, Website and Snack Bar
- VIII. Video Production – Keith Pickering-Walters (see attached)
  - a. 2 years ago got 6 new computers from the district and later was able to add 2 more. When software was updated the computers couldn't handle it.
  - b. New software would enable student groups that work on each computer to be smaller
  - c. May put the old computers in the library
  - d. Would like to order 27 in, IMAC for a grand total of about \$30K
  - e. Looking to Supporters for the entire amount
  - f. Roxanne Kusske moves to fund not more than \$30K for Video Production
  - g. Ian Murphy seconds the motion
  - h. The motion to give Video Production not more than \$30K for computers passes
- IX. Baseball – Corrigan Willis (Baseball coach)
  - a. It has been over 10 years since the wind screening has been replaced
  - b. Tournament Coast about \$500 each, other costs total \$13.2K, coaching stipend \$9.2K, quote for 1020 linear ft windscreen \$4288.69, quote for 2 home plate turf mats \$929.68
  - c. \$10K needed for cages. Held a golf tournament for updating cages.
  - d. Team doing the installation of the windscreen to defer cost.
  - e. Baseball second to track in eScrip sign ups
  - f. Baseball has never asked Supporters for money
  - g. Motion to fund wind screen by Brian Poynter
  - h. Ian Murphy seconds motion
  - i. Motion to fund windscreens passes
- X. History – Sommer Newkirk
  - a. Close-Up trip to Washington DC, run by non-profit organization
  - b. Normally go during school, asked to go during Spring Break this year
  - c. The goal was to get 10 students to go, but fell short of that goal so there is a \$465 penalty that has to be paid

- d. Motion to pay the penalty incurred by the Close-Up trip in an amount not to exceed \$500 made by Steve Goodman
- e. Ian Murphy seconds motion
- f. Motion to pay the penalty for the Close-Up trip passes
